Self-designed course, approved by university accreditation body; built novel curriculum around a variety of primary and secondary art historical documents, art objects, theoretical texts, and films; introduces students not only to the world of Soviet Nonconformist visual art, but also to the historical and political context that shaped the period and the artistic movements therein.builds upon foundation concerning what preceded the underground movements, from the Russian and Soviet avant-garde to Stalinist Socialist realism, before examining the development of Soviet Nonconformist art from the mid 1950s to current day Russian art activism; opens up the discourse to the Baltics, Georgia, Ukraine, and Central Asia, moving beyond a Russian-centric approach to Soviet Nonconformist art toward a more comprehensive understanding of what was occurring across the Soviet Union
